A few highlights from email: I haven't gotten responses from colleges about virtual registration for SRM yet, but I sense that is forthcoming based on earlier email traffic. The amount to pay for Section awards was more than what we budgeted for by \$184. I think the BOD of needs to be aware of this increase in cost and adjust for the 2023 budget. I would not recommend us do anything different with awards, I believe we just undershot the amount for this year's budget by rolling the figures forward from last year.
